#### Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Ordinances listed below were formulated and implemented to speak to these safety concerns.

We want it known that we love all of our students and appreciate our parents and that only a cohesive Burton family/learning community can insure the academic success of our students. We encourage you to take some time to review the Safety Ordinances listed below.

If you have any concerns regarding your child, the first step is to schedule an appointment with the teacher by calling the office and contacting Ms. Brooks or Ms. Ray. Issues are usually resolved at this level. Each teacher's conference schedule is attached for your convenience. Subsequently, a conference may be scheduled with our Assistant Principal (Mr. Bailey), or Principal (Dr. Wilson).

Your adherence to this procedure is greatly appreciated and we look forward to assisting you in any way possible.

#### City of Detroit Ordinances

ORDINANCE:

38-7-2 - Disturbing Schools

Shall not make or assist in making noise, disturbance or improper diversion by which the peace and good order of any public/private/parochial school is disturbed.

**ORDINANCE:** 

38-7-3 - Profanity, Immoral Conduct

Shall not use profane, indecent or immoral language or indulge in profane, indecent or immoral conduct in any school building or adjacent to any school building.

ORDINACE:

38-7-4 - Unauthorized Persons not to Enter or Remain in School Buildings

Shall not enter or remain in any school building without first reporting to Administrative Offices and identifying self to Principal or designee.




#### Burton International

#### Burton International Academy Practical Learning Experiences and Self Exploration

**Program Overview** 

P.L.E.A.S.E. is dedicated to providing the highest quality After Care services for children in PreKindergarten through Grade 8 at Burton International Academy. Our Program provides age-appropriate activities in an enriching environment by certified, experienced teachers. We strive to provide consistency with staffing, routines and activities. Any student in Grades PreK-8 who remains on the school grounds after school hours MUST be enrolled in the PLEASE Program.

Students are place in age-appropriate groups for homework time, group activities, outdoor games and small group time. All students are placed together for the last hour of the Program. A minimum of two staff members will remain with

the students during this time.

**Hours of Operation** 

P.L.E.A.S.E. is available to all children from 2:45 – 6:00 p.m. daily (2:00 – 6:00 on Fridays). Parents **MUST** sign your child out from Program. <u>Parents will be charged</u>

until 6:00 p.m. if you do not sign your child out.

Children must be picked up no later than 6:00 p.m. There will be a late fee assessment of \$2.00 per minute for every minute of additional care after 6:00 p.m. Late fee must be paid with cash or check (payable to the waiting After Care Staff member) at the time of pick up. The child may not return to the P.L.E.A.S.E. Program until this payment is made. If a child is picked up late two times in one semester, a meeting with a P.L.E.A.S.E. Coordinator may be required before your child may resume using the service.

The P.L.E.A.S.E. Program will be closed on holidays, conference days, half

days and all other "no school" days.

Safety

To ensure the safety of ALL children, students enrolled in the PLEASE Program must **report directly** to their assigned classrooms. They MAY NOT go outside before reporting. Students who do not comply with this rule may be dismissed from the Program.

Parents must provide emergency numbers and names of adults authorized to pick up each month. We must also be informed of any medical conditions.

**Payment Schedule** 

Statements are produced every other Monday. Payments are due by that Friday. \*A \$10 late fee will be assessed for payments not submitted by due dates.\* Payments may be made by cash, check, or money order payable to Burton PLEASE.

#### **Payment Plans**

Families enrolling 2 or more siblings will receive a 20% discount.

Registration, Fees and Forms

There is a registration fee of \$30.00 per family. A registration form MUST be completed by all families utilizing the program regardless of the frequency of use. A Child Information Record MUST be completed for each child enrolling in the program. These forms must be completed before your child may use the program. Rates are as follows:

#### **Additional Programs**

The PLEASE Program must be notified in writing if your child will be attending other programs in the building. Children coming to the PLEASE Program from another registered activity will be charged from the time (1st hour) that they sign in. There will be a 15 minute grace period.

#### **Past Due Accounts**

If your PLEASE account is delinquent and your child is brought to the program, you will be contacted to pick up your child. If you cannot be reached, your child's emergency contact will be called to pick up your child. Parents with outstanding balances for the 2011-2012 school year may not register for the 2012-2013 school year until that balance is paid in full.

#### **Returned Checks**

There will be a \$25.00 service charge for ALL returned checks. If a check is returned, personal checks will no longer be accepted from that family.

#### **TAX Identification**

A tax statement for payments made to the PLEASE program will be provided in January of 2013 as outlined by Federal law.

#### PROCESS FOR PARENT CONCERNS

Parents may occasionally have concerns involving school policies, student grades or personnel. The following is a suggested course of action for working with the school to discuss and resolve problems:

- 1. Start at your local school.
- Review your child's school planner or handbook for individual school rules and policies.
- 3. Make an appointment to discuss your concern with the teacher.
- Concerns not resolved by the teacher should be addressed in an appointment with the principal or his designee.
- Concerns not resolved by the principal or his designee should be addressed to the Parent and Community Liaison.
- Concerns not resolved by the Parent and Community Liaison should be addressed
  to the Assistant Superintendent for your local school's constellation. Provide any
  documentation you may have of incidents should they need further attention.
- 7. Disciplinary actions must follow due process according to the Student Code of Conduct. If you desire to appeal the outcome, you must follow the District's appeal process as outlined in the district's Student Code of Conduct Policy booklet.
